### Membership of Target Rifle Victoria Inc.

The following are extracts from our Constitution/By-laws:-

Constitution:-

#### PART 3 MEMBERS, DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES, AND GRIEVANCES

##### 9. Application for membership

(3) Membership of individual members or member clubs whose fees are unpaid on the first day of the Membership Year may be suspended. The membership of any Individual Member or Member Club who fails to pay all outstanding fees within thirty (30) days of the commencement of the Membership Year shall be cancelled.

The current membership fees for the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2023 are:-

Concession and Pensioner cardholder members	\$120.00
Junior members	\$120.00
Sub-junior members	\$102.00
Non-shooters	\$ 91.00
Family	\$305.00
Schools	\$ 40.00
Seniors	\$175.00

If you have not paid your membership, it is now overdue, and you will not be insured, nor will you be eligible to shoot in a TRV-sponsored event.

If you require a membership renewal, please email [membership@trv.org.au](mailto:membership@trv.org.au) with your name and membership number.

**NB** In accordance with our Constitution and By-laws - if you have not paid your dues on or before December 31 of the relevant year, then you are not eligible to be registered to participate in **any** TRV competitions until all dues have been paid.

This means that if you have not paid in full on or before December 31, any registration to participate in an event cannot even be considered by TRV or, in particular, the Competitions Officer.

From next year, 2024, this requirement to be fully paid up by 31/12/23 will be applied. The main reason for this is that it is impossible for the Competitions Officer to register competition application/registration forms for 2024 for unpaid members because those people are actually **NOT YET MEMBERS OF TRV**, and, therefore, cannot be included in, especially, competitions that start early in the New Year.

In other words, if you want to be included in competitions that commence at the beginning of the year, then you **MUST** be a paid-up member **by** the 31<sup>st</sup> of December 2023.

Round One Week commencing 12<sup>th</sup> June 2023

**Entry fee: First team \$50.00. each additional team \$25.00**

Teams will consist of Six (6) members, with Five (5) to count. Up to Ten (10) members may be nominated to the team. Other shooters named on the entry form may compete for individual prizes but may not compete in the team. Shooters with no TRV Grade for this event must supply their last three scores or they will not be accepted into the team.

Teams will be graded using the four highest averages from those named in the team.

**Note: Interstate Competitors, you MUST supply your First and Last Name, Date of Birth, Gender and local State registration number, if you cannot provide this information you will NOT be able to enter the competition. Also, if you would like any prizes sent, you will need to provide a postal address.**

Competition stickers are to be placed behind any competition aiming mark before commencing. All cards **MUST** be completed with Shooter Name, TRV Number, Signature and Date and have Witness Name and Signature.

TRV Competitions Policy, Australian Supplementary Rules and ISSF Rules will apply.

A new scoring process will be trialled for this event. All teams are to nominate a scorer and that person is to score the targets and return the scores to the competition officer by email before the end of the Monday following the end of the shooting week for that round. 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## An important message from Trevor Clapp

### HANDLING LEAD WITH BARE HANDS

Some studies have found lead can be absorbed through the skin. If you handle lead ammunition and then touch your eyes, nose, or mouth, you could be exposed.

Lead dust can also get on your clothes and your hair. If this happens, it's possible that you may track home some of the lead dust, which may also expose your family.

All shooters should wash their hands after touching lead-contained ammunition and cleaning rifles removing lead from the butts and other equipment that may have in contact with lead or lead dust.

### SAFETY TIPS

Wear a mask and gloves when removing lead from the Range.

Wear old throw-away clothes or throw-away coveralls.

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## Leongatha Small Bore Rifle Club 'Grant' Experience – from Chris Sergeant

In February 2021, on behalf of the club, I applied for a grant – Round 4 of the Shooting Sports Facilities Program from the Department of Jobs Precincts and Regions (Sport and Recreation Victorian State Government).

The reason/purpose for the application was to address declining membership by improving club facilities. Recently, we lost female and potential members due to our lack of adequate facilities. The nearest public toilet to the club is 100 metres away, next to the skate park, and with poor lighting. The club shoots on Friday nights, and as such, there was a perceived need for club members to be chaperoned. We had talked about improving the facilities for years and finally took the plunge. We decided to have a disabled toilet cubicle constructed within the footprint of our existing building.

The process was quite arduous as it is designed to be well above favouritism – sports rorts etc. We were given a deadline, when all paperwork in relation to the application was to be submitted. In addition to the 7-page application form, we needed approval from DWELP as the Leongatha Recreation Reserve is on Crown Land. Also, approval from the Recreation Committee of Management. Quotes from local contractors, including Council permits and decisions regarding how much work club members were going to do themselves.

Our club had to contribute one-sixth of the amount required for the construction of the new disabled toilet – all the figures etc were on the grant application. The attachments to the grant application included: A letter of support from the peak body (TRV), written approvals/permits from the Shire Council, land owner and land manager, Copy of Banks Statements to show our ability to pay the clubs portion, Completed 'Code of Fair Play', Land Tenure arrangements, Police Range Approval, plans, quotes, photos etc. etc.

We were subsequently successful in our application, and I believe the purpose of our application helped it get over the line. As well as a disabled toilet, we had wheelchair access improved in the club with the widening of two doorways and construction of a ramp onto the range. From that point, we had milestones and payments to meet with monthly online meetings to keep us on track. Staff at Sport and Recreation were very helpful and of great assistance during the whole process.

In addition to the moneys sought in the grant application, we were given an additional 20K for the establishment of an Environmental Management Plan (EMP). The EMP came as part of the grant and was something we had to do as a successful applicant. We had to employ a company to prepare an Environmental Management Plan, which basically identifies the ways our club affects the environment – lead contamination, noise etc. and suggests ways to negate/reduce them. We worked with Ewan from Water Bear Solutions on the ways in which the club could reduce our environmental footprint, and they were included in the plan. Ewan is an ex-TRV member and now works interstate but was able to complete our 39-page EMP with ease. I was told during our monthly

meetings with Sport and Rec that our EMP was the best they had seen. With the money left over after Water Bear had been paid for their work, we were able to improve the stop butt. We had a roof constructed over the target area and devised a better means to catch the lead. This was necessary as the main problem we had was water/rain mixing with the lead and potentially compromising the water table. The bonus for us is that our targets no longer get wet when shooting at 50 metres.

Since the completion of the works, we have kept going on the maintenance and given the inside a paint and installed some new benches etc. Now we have the outside to tackle.

Our club is proudly hosting Congress later this year and holding a shoot on the same weekend; perhaps we will see you there on Sunday the 9<sup>th</sup> of July.

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## From the Oakleigh Rifle Club

As you will have heard, the Oakleigh Rifle Club was successful with the Round 5 Grant from SRV. The grant allows the club to replace the roof of the two ranges and the club room. The existing tin on the roof is totally rusted out and leaks badly during any sort of rain event.

The club was established in May 1900, with the signing of 100 signatures from local Oakleigh residents in a petition sent to the Department of the Army to establish a new rifle club. The club has occupied the site on Victorian Railway land under a 99-year lease from the Commissioners of the Railways. That lease has, of course, run out, and we are now on a rolling 5-year lease from Victrack.

The new tin roof includes insulation which will be of great benefit during the hot summer months and hopefully will provide a new lease on life for our club, which incidentally is heritage listed by the City of Monash as one of the last free-standing timber buildings from the 1900s. Over the years, the club has produced quite a number of State and National level competitors as well as many successful international athletes. The club was heavily involved with TRV administration in the 1940s (VSBRU back then). It later assisted in keeping the Frankston International Small-bore Rifle Club alive during its transition from the old site to its present home. For a small club, it has a rich and successful history. This new roof will give the club a new lease of life and hopefully help keep it going for another 100 years.
