20m Prone 60 shots

20m Benchrest 60 shots

50m Prone 60 shots

50m Standing 40 shots

50m Kneeling 40 shots

90m Prone 60 shots

90m Benchrest 60 shots

20m and 50m Prone Dual Range

## Categories for records are:

Sub Junior: Open, Male and Female (under 16 on 31<sup>st</sup> December in the year of the competition)

Junior: Open, Male and Female (under 21 on 31<sup>st</sup> December in the year of the competition)

Senior: Open, Male and Female **Senior now Open as per below amendment**

Veteran: Open, Male and Female (over 65 on 31<sup>st</sup> December in the year of the competition)

## Item 4.9 September 2016 Council Meeting

It was decided there is no need for the judging convenor to ratify the records as they are scored and check scored at the competition.

## October 2016 Council Meeting Motion

At any approved Master Marksmen, Bench Master or State Championships match, a Sub-Junior competitor is eligible to claim the Sub-Junior, Junior and Open TRV State Records should their score be high enough. A Junior competitor is eligible to claim the Junior and Open TRV State Records should their score be high enough. A Veteran competitor is eligible to claim the Veteran and Open TRV State Records should their score be high enough. Effective from 1st January 2017.
